SOME RESOURCES DEALING WITH WORLD HISTORY AVAILABLE IN THE MESA COLLEGE LIBRARY

Africa South of the Sahara – Each country in the region is covered, including physical and social geography; history; economy; statistics; a directory that includes information on the government, religion, education, tourism, and more;; and a bibliography. Regional organizations and more are covered at the end of the volume. **REF. DT 351 A37**

Africana: The Encyclopedia of the African and African American Experience – A single volume covering "Africa and her diaspora" in alphabetically arranged articles that run from a few lines to several pages. Nations, ethnic groups, important people, cities, geographical features, culture, and more for Africa, the Caribbean, Latin America, North America, Europe, Asia, and the rest of the world are all covered to varying degrees. Articles are supplemented by color and b&w photos, illustrations, maps, and tables. An alphabetical list of articles in the front and a bibliography at the back complete the volume. **REF. DT 14** A37435

Age of Wars of Religion, 1000-1650: An Encyclopedia of Global Warfare and Civilization – 2 vols. – Alphabetically arranged entries cover all aspects of religious wars in history, including important people, events, terms, etc. Cross-references; sets of b&w maps at the beginning of each volume; and a chronology of major events, bibliography, and index at the end of vol. 2 enhance the set. **REF. D 114 N66**

Dictionary of Ancient Egypt – All aspects of Ancient Egyptian life are covered in alphabetically arranged entries supplemented by color photos, maps, and diagrams. **REF. DT 58 S54**

Dictionary of Black African Civilization – Covers "the creative life and history of Afria as displayed in its culture, techniques and extraordinarily varied social relationships." Alphabetical entries are supplemented by b&w photos. Maps are on the inner front and back covers. **REF. KT 352 B315z**

Dictionary of Historic Documents – Short descriptions of documents (not the documents themselves) are alphabetically arranged with short bibliographies at the end of each. A "Timetable of Documents," a list of articles by category, and an index are at the end. **REF. D 9 D525**

Dictionary of the Vietnam War – All elements of the war are included in short, alphabetically arranged, entries. Appendices (including maps) and an index are at the end of the book. **REF. DS 557.7 D53**

Dictionary of Wars – Covers wars throughout history: "global conflicts, civil wars, mutinies, punitive expeditions, undeclared wars, rebellions, and revolutions that have occurred the world over." Includes information on "political, social, economic and cultural influences on military operations." B&w drawings, cross-references, and geographical and general indexes augment the alphabetical entries. **REF. D 25 A2 D53**

Dictionary of World History – Short alphabetically arranged entries cover a variety of topics "selected by their historical significance," excluding anything dealing with prehistory. Major civilizations, events, leaders, and the nations of the world are among the things covered. Maps; tables; charts; appendices on leaders, organizations, disasters, and more; and a chronology augment the entries. **REF. D 9 H87**

Dictionary of World Politics – Terms relating to both historical and current political events, institutions, concepts, practices, and international relations are among those defined in alphabetical order. A set of b&w maps are at the end. **REF. D 419 K87**

Encyclopedia of African History – 3 vols. – B&w maps and photos, cross-references, and article bibliographies augment the alphabetically arranged articles. A-Z and thematic entry lists at the beginning of vol. 1 and an index at the end of vol. 3 complete the set. **REF. DT 20 E53**

Encyclopedia of Asian History – 4 vols. – Alphabetically arranged articles are supplemented by b&w photos, maps, tables, short bibliographies at the end of each article, and (in vol. 4) lists of entries and maps, a Chinese (Pinyin)-English conversion table, a synoptic outline, and an index. Articles cover all Asian countries, important people, and eras. **REF. DS 31 E53**

Encyclopedia of Contemporary French Culture – Alphabetically arranged articles on all aspects of French culture: art, cinema, performing arts, intellectual life, literature, music, and more. A subject-arranged list of articles in the front and an index in the back supplement the articles. REF. DC 33.7 E53. Other titles in the series are the Encyclopedia of Contemporary German Culture (REF. DD 290.36 E53), the Encyclopedia of Contemporary Italian Culture (REF. DG 450 E53), and the Encyclopedia of Contemporary Spanish Culture (REF. DP 233.5 E63).

Encyclopedia of Genocide and Crimes Against Humanity – 3 vols. - Covers a variety of aspects "in the context of the history of individual countries and the world at large," including events, perpetrators, victims, laws, the roles of institutions and organizations, and "tools and manifestations of the phenomenon" (e.g. philosophy, propaganda, literature, film). Article bibliographies, b&w photos, cross-references, a glossary, filmography, list of primary sources, section sof "historical texts" and judicial decisions, and an index augment the main text. **REF. HV 6322.7 E532**

Encyclopedia of India – 4 vols. – "Historical, political, religious, and cultural information" is provided in alphabetically arranged articles, supplemented by b&w and color photos, maps, cross-references, and article bibliographies. Chronologies for India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka are at the front of vol. 1. A selection of primary sources, a glossary, a general bibliography, and an index are at the back of vol. 4. Color maps are on the inner front and back covers. **REF. DS 405 E556**

Encyclopedia of the Korean War: A Political, Social, and Military History – 3 vols. – Vols. 1 & 2 contain alphabetically arranged articles on people, places, events, and other material dealing with the war supplemented by b&w photos, maps, and short bibliographies at the end of each article. Vol. 3 contains a list of entries, maps, documents arranged by year, a timeline, glossary, bibliography, and index. **REF. DS 918 E53**

Encyclopedia of the Modern Middle East -4 vols. - Alphabetically arranged articles are supplemented by b&w photos, maps, short bibliographies at the end of each article, a list maps (in vol. 1), diagrams of genealogies and lines of succession, a list of biographical entries by category, and an index. All aspects of the modern Middle East are covered. **REF. DS 43 E53**

Encyclopedia of World History – Short alphabetically arranged entries provide basic facts on people, dates, events, monuments, and more "over the past 17,000 years." Color photos, maps, drawings, charts, photos, diagrams, and tables supplement the text. A chronology and "Ready Reference" are at the back. **REF. D 21 E577**

Essential Middle East: A Comprehensive Guide – Biographies, wars, places, history, treaties, religions, literature, politics, and tourist attractions are among the areas covered by short entries. Maps and an index augment the entries. **REF. DS 43 H57**

Facts About China – Includes chapters on "geography, peoples, and languages; systems of thought and belief; health and medicine; the arts, entertainment, and sports; literature; science and technology; the economy; and important institutions that govern Chinese society." Bibliographies are included at the end of each chapter. Also provides a chronology of Chinese history, a section on "significant figures, movements, and ideas that inform Chinese culture," and information on traveling in China. An appendix that includes a map of China and an index complete the volume. **REF. DS 706 F25**

Great Events from History: Ancient and Medieval Series – 3 vols. – Chronologically arranged articles cover the domestication of the horse through the painting of the Last Supper by Leonard da Vinci. Articles provide event type, date, location, "principal personages," an event summary, and "additional recommended reading" at the end of each. An alphabetical list of events, key word index, category index, personage index, and bibliography are at the end of vol. 3. REF. D 21 M344. Also available are the Modern European Series (3 vols., REF. D 209 M29), The Ancient World: Prehistory – 476 C.E. (2 vols., REF. D 65 G74), and The Middle Ages (2 vols., REF. D 119 G74).

Historical Dictionary of Ancient Egypt – People, places, life, and more are covered in short alphabetical entries. Cross-references, a bibliography, appendices of dynastic lists and museums with Egyptian collections complete the volume. **REF. DT 83 B56**

Holocaust Encyclopedia – Alphabetically arranged entries cover events, policy decisions, cities, individuals, and other aspects of the Holocaust. B&w photos, maps, cross-references, a bibliographical essay, and an index supplement the entries. **REF. D 804.25 H66**

Immigration and Asylum From 1900 to the Present – 3 vols. – B&w photos, article bibliographies, and cross-references supplement alphabetically arranged articles in vols. 1 and 2 dealing with the "history and current status of immigrants and refugees – their stories, the events that led to their movement, and the place of these movements in contemporary history and politics." Vol. 3 contains the texts of relevant documents and an index to the set. **REF. JV 6012 I56**

Japan: An Illustrated Encyclopedia - 2 vols. – Short entries are augmented by b&w and color photos and maps, tables, cross-references, pictoral essays, and feature articles (the latter two listed at the front of vol. 1). A section of color maps (with index), a chronology, a bibliography, and a bilingual index are at the end of vol. 2. **REF. DS 805 J263**

Kingdoms of Europe: An Illustrated Encyclopedia of Ruling Monarchs from Ancient Times to the Present – Empires and kingdoms from the Roman Empire through modern Europe are covered in separate sections, each of which include maps, drawings and photos, and lists of the rulers. An Index completes the volume. **REF. D 107 G85**

Korean War Almanac – B&w photos and maps supplement the alphabetically arranged entries on all aspects of the war, including important people. A bibliography and an index are at the end of the book. **REF. DS 918 S86**

New Encyclopedia of Archaeological Excavations in the Holy Land – 4 vols. – B&w and color photos, maps, and diagrams augment the detailed articles. An abbreviations list at the beginning of each volume and chronological tables; a glossary; and indexes to persons, places, and biblical references at the end of vol. 4 complete the set. **REF. DS 111 A2 E5813**

New York Public Library Book of Chronologies – Exploration, nations, politics, business, technology, the arts, religion, science, military history, media, and sports are among the areas covered. A bibliography and index complete the volume. **REF. D 11 W47**

Oxford Companion to British History – All aspects of British history, including important people, are covered in short, alphabetically arranged, entries. B&w maps, a genealogy of the various ruling houses, cross-references, and an index are also provided. **REF. DA 34 O93**. Other Oxford Companions include **The Oxford Companion to Classical Civilization (REF. DE 5 O94)**, and **The Oxford Companion to Military History (REF. D 25 A2 O94)**.

Oxford Companion to Military History – "Ranges across centuries and continents to provide [...] coverage of war and warfare." Includes military leaders, theorists, and inventors; weapons and equipment; wars, campaigns, and battles; strategy and tactics; logistics; fortifications; military life and institutions; and literature, art, and music. Provides "the social, political, technological, and economic background to major

conflicts." Alphabetical articles are augmented by b&w photos, maps, sidebars, cross-references, article bibliographies, and an index. **REF. D 25 A2 O94**

Oxford Encyclopedia of Ancient Egypt – 3 vols. – All aspects of ancient Egypt, including archaeological discoveries, are covered in alphabetically arranged articles supplemented by b&w photos, diagrams, illustrations, and short bibliographies at the ends of articles. Vol. 3 also contains a "synoptic outline of contents" and an index. **REF. DT 58 O94**. Also available is the 4-vol. **Oxford Encyclopedia of the Modern Islamic World (REF. DS 35.53 O95)**.

Regional Surveys of the World – Single volumes cover the geography, economy, history, and statistical information on education, health, agriculture, industry, government, and more about countries in specific areas of the world, with a bibliography completing each entry. Additional regional information on organizations, research institutes, and more; bibliographies of books and periodicals; and an index of regional organizations are at the end. Titles in the series cover Africa South of the Sahara (REF. DT 351 A37), The Far East and Australia (REF. DS 1 F3), and The Middle East and North Africa (REF. DS 49 M5).

Simon and Schuster Encyclopedia of World War II – Alpabetically arranged entries cover people, events, places, and more. Maps, b&w photos, a glossary of terms and abbreviations, a chronology, a bibliography, and an index supplement the entries. **REF. D 740 S57**

Southeast Asia: A Historical Encyclopedia from Angkor Wat to East Timor – 3 vols. – Cross-references, article bibliographies, and b&w photos and maps augment alphabetically arranged articles. A detailed introductory article in vol. 1 and a map section, appendices (including a chronology), a large bibliography, and an index are in vol. 3. REF. DS 524 S68

Vietnam War: An Almanac – A chronology of the war is followed by articles on the various forces (land, sea, air) used, biographies of important people, a bibliography, and an index. B&w photos enhance the text. **REF. DS 557.7 V5**

These are only <u>some</u> of the resources available. Material on World History can also be found in more general reference works. Check Sandy Pac, the online databases, some of the Library's other handouts, and other indexes available in the Library.
