APA DICTIONARY OF PSYCHOLOGY – This alphabetically arranged set of definitions of terms used in all areas of psychology includes cross-references, translations of foreign terms, and short biographies of major figures in the field. A “Guide to the Dictionary” in the front and several appendices at the end complete the volume. **REF. BF 31 A63**

DIAGNOSTIC AND STATISTICAL MANUAL OF MENTAL DISORDERS, FOURTH EDITION (DSM-IV) – The standard handbook for diagnosis by practitioners and researchers in the fields of psychology and psychiatry. Covers major clinical and personality syndromes, including formal diagnostic criteria. Contains symptom and diagnostic indexes. **REF. RC 455.2 C4 D54**

DICTIONARY OF PSYCHOLOGY – This alphabetically arranged set of definitions of terms used in psychology includes cross-references, translations of foreign terms, and phrases alphabetized by the first word in natural order (rather than last word, rest of phrase). A “how to use” page in the front and seven appendices at the end dealing with such topics as DSM-IV terms, the Greek alphabet, measuring instruments, symbols, and thumbnail biographies, complete the volume. **REF. BF 31 C72**

EBSCO PSYCHARTICLES – An online database of American Psychological Association (APA) full-text, peer-reviewed scholarly and scientific articles, with more than 45,000 journal articles, letters to the editor and errata from 57 journals - 46 published by the American Psychological Association (APA) and 11 from allied organizations. Covers 1985 to present. Two additional databases, **EBSCO Psychology & Behavioral Science Collection** and **ProQuest Psychology Journals**, are also available. Look under “**Article & Research Databases**” on the Library’s home page.

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF HUMAN BEHAVIOR - A 4-volume alphabetically arranged set dealing with all aspects of human behavior. Each survey article includes a glossary of terms and a bibliography. Tables, diagrams, and illustrations may also be found. An index for the entire set is found at the end of Volume 4. **REF. BF 31 E5**

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF HUMAN EMOTIONS - A 2-volume alphabetically arranged set of survey articles on all aspects of human emotions, each with a bibliography. Some articles are supplemented by illustrations, including b&w photos. Cross-references throughout and bibliographic and subject indexes at the end of vol. 2 complete the set. **REF. BF 531 E55**

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF HUMAN INTELLIGENCE - A 2-volume alphabetically arranged set covering all areas of human intelligence. A bibliography appears at the end of each survey article and there are cross-references throughout. Illustrations (tables, etc.) supplement some of the articles. An index to the entire set is at the end of vol. 2. **REF. BF 431 E59**

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF MULTICULTURAL PSYCHOLOGY – Alphabetically arranged articles, “viewed through the lens of the racial and ethnic minority experience,” are supplemented by individual bibliographies and an index at the end. **REF. GN 502 E63**

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF PSYCHOLOGY - An 8-volume alphabetically arranged set covering all areas of psychology, including people. Articles include bibliographies and there is an index in vol. 8. **REF. BF 31 E52**

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF PSYCHOLOGY - A 4-volume alphabetically arranged set dealing with all aspects of psychology including important persons, living and dead. Many articles have "further references" at the end. More than half of volume 4 is a bibliography, with the rest of the volume containing name and subject indexes. **REF. BF 31 E522.**

ESSAY AND GENERAL LITERATURE INDEX (EGLI) - An author and subject index to collections of essays that allows you to see the "contents" of the collections. This reference tool may be used in all subject areas. Many of the books indexed are available in this library. Consult the Sandy Pac computers. **Index Table.**

GENERAL SCIENCE INDEX (1979-2003) - A subject listing to scholarly journals on such topics as medicine, psychiatry, biology, chemistry, physics, and nutrition. A separate book review section is at the back. **Index Table.**

LONGMAN DICTIONARY OF PSYCHOLOGY AND PSYCHIATRY - Definitions of psychiatric terms are supplemented by appendices listing DSM classifications, psychological and neurological tests, therapy types, and other fields covered in the book. **REF. BF 31 L66**

OXFORD COMPANION TO THE MIND - Covers people and ideas dealing with the mind: how it functions, people who have studied it, illnesses, etc. Articles range from a few lines to several pages and many are supplemented by cross-references, diagrams and b&w photos. Longer articles have bibliographies at the end. An index completes the volume. **REF. BF 31 O94**

PSYCHOLOGICAL ABSTRACTS - The library has the 1990-1993 issues of this listing of books, journal articles, technical reports, and other documents. Abstracts of each article are provided under 16 major classifications. Author and "brief subject" indexes are provided. Note: this is not an easy source to use, nor will the library have all the materials cited, but it is the most subject-specific of all the sources. **Index Table.**

PSYCHOLOGY BASICS – A 2-volume, alphabetically arranged set of articles dealing with 17 major areas of psychology, including cognition, intelligence, learning, memory, personality, and stress. Important theories are also covered. Bibliographies at the end of each article and (in volume 2) a glossary, list of articles by category, and index complete the set. **REF. BF 31 P765**

PUBLICATION MANUAL OF THE AMERICAN PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION – Provides all needed information on the creation of a publishable manuscript in conformance with the Association's required style. Covers content, organization, dealing with bias, use of abbreviations, citing sources, submission of the completed manuscript, and more. Includes tables, figures, and examples. **REF. BF 76.7 P83**

SOCIAL SCIENCES INDEX (1974-2003) - An author and subject listing of scholarly periodical articles in a variety of areas, including psychology. A separate book review section is at the back. **Index Table.**
